

## COMMON PLANT AND FOOD DANGERS

Some seemingly innocent plants and foods can be harmful to your pets. Here is a list of common plants and foods that should be kept away from your pets. Print this list and keep it handy. There is also emergency contact information at the end of this article.

**HARMFUL PLANTS** – if you have these plants in or around your home, make sure your pet can't get to them, or consider getting rid of them altogether.
